<sup>6</sup>Four courses (12 hours) of upper-level journalism and electronic media. Students are encouraged to select courses from a specialty area including sports journalism, science journalism, media management, print/web journalism, broadcast journalism, visual communication, and magazine journalism.

<sup>7</sup>Six hours in the College of Communication and Information, including Journalism and Electronic Media.

<sup>8</sup>Fifteen hours in the College of Arts and Sciences.

<sup>9</sup>Any upper-division (300- or 400-level) political science course.

<sup>10</sup>Any course not taught in advertising, journalism and electronic media, or public relations.
